### **Minutes of Committee Meeting Held on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2008**

#### **Item 1. Attendance and Apologies**

The minutes of the previous meeting were proposed by John Cullen and seconded by Gail.

#### **Item 2. Treasurer's Report**

The balance in the account was £1,999.11. There had been £200 donated to Douglas Academy. This had gone towards pupils going to the European Youth Parliament. Rona had received a letter of thanks from the school.

#### **Item 3. Matters Arising**

Some discussion centred around the proposed housing and the trees that would be under threat as a result. Tony Finlay of EDC had also expressed concern. It was thought that planning would deal with this in the new year and we should monitor the situation. We had asked for a reduction in the number of houses to be built.

There is no longer an assigned police officer for the area and it would be next spring before the situation would be resolved.

There had been at least one house broken into and a couple of cars stolen that had been left with the engine running.

Inspector Ross had been dealing with the tents in the woods which Neil had told him about.

#### **Item 5. Mains Park**
